Healthy Futures is an Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation program which is a problem-solving and capacity-building, prevention-based, multi-level service in which mental health professionals partner with families, child development center staff, and Home providers to promote healthy social-emotional development.

Program Setting: Healthy Futures serves child development centers in every ward in the district and is currently expanding to include all child development centers that have children birth to three and accept subsidy.
